



A skill we have been practising at nursery!

<u>What to do: (with an at home twist)</u>

- Together with your child choose a toy (puppet, soft toy, hard toy anything will work)
- When your child goes to bed, place the particular toy on, in or under something. In the morning encourage them to find it.
- For example, if the spider is on a shoe, your child thinks of a word to rhyme with shoe. (Shoe and Moo).
 - You sing the rhyme together. "There's a spider on the shoe, on the shoe, there's a spider on the shoe, on the shoe. There's a spider on the shoe and I think he just said moo! There's a spider on the shoe on the shoe!"
- If your child thinks of something that rhymes, but isn't a real word go for it! But then encourage and help them to think of a real word that rhymes.
- Write the rhyme down, soon you will have your own rhyme book!
- Move the spider (toy) each night to a different position.
- If you struggle to think of rhyming words, Google!

What skills will your child develop?

- Literacy: Reading: Rhyme.
- Expressive arts and design: Being imaginative.
- Communication and Language: Understanding: Positional language (on, in, under)
