Which finger did he bite?


This little finger on my right.

What to talk about:: Practice counting to 10. Encourage your child to tell you what each toy is as they find it, where was it hiding?



In the story the fish find a hairy scary monster.

"Everyone's scared of me" he sobbed. No one EVER wants to play." Barry smiled. "Don't worry, I can help you. I know exactly what to do"

Activity: Lets talk about our feelings. How do you feel when you play with your friends? How did the hairy scary monster feel when no one wanted to play? What makes you happy? What makes you sad?

What to do next: Ask your child to show you a happy face, a sad face, an angry face, an excited face. What other expressions do they know?

Move on to numbers 10-20 if your child is ready.

Add dots to the other side of the fish and ask your

child to count them to find the number.

What to talk about: Take turns with your child "my turn now"
