
(Stick Song)

Journey Stick

On your walk or, out in the garden, ask your child to find a stick. Explain you want them to also collect different things they see while they are out, e.g. leaves, feathers etc. You can personalise your **stick** by attaching the things you find using blu tac, string, sellotape etc. You could add to the stick each time you go on a walk. These are known as Journey sticks and are a tactile way of recording a journey and remembering it later on.

Talk to your child about what they have found and seen when they have been out. Describe the objects. What do they look like.? What do they feel like? etc.

For this activity you can use you can use things such as sticks, spoons, musical beaters or just your hands. All children love to move in different ways. Once you have played the song to your child and had a dance, you could extend it by thinking of different ways to move.

With the sticks you find you could have lots of fun creating different letters from your child's name.

Give your child an example (e.g A for Alfie) you could use masking tape or string to tie the letter you have created together so it will not come apart.
