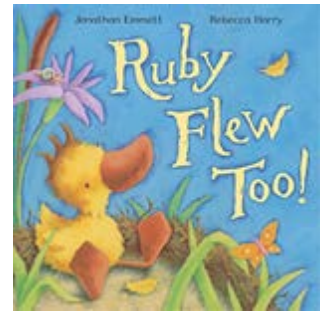


Ruby Flew Too!

Egg Decorating

At home, why not decorate some eggs of your own?

Polystyrene eggs can be purchased from ASDA, or Home Bargains or you could ask a grown up to hard boil some real eggs!

Once the eggs are hard and cooled use paints, felt pens, pencils, glue and collage materials to decorate the eggs. Could you make five just like in the story?

Chocolate Egg Nest

Why not have a go at some delicious chocolate nests!

Melt 200g of chocolate; add 100g of cereal (shredded wheat broken into pieces works well). Mix together and spoon into paper cake cases, using the back of a spoon to make a dip in the middle. Add in some chocolate eggs and leave to set.

Floating and Sinking Ducks

In the story Ruby is the smallest duck of them all. Could you make some ducks using pebbles or plastic bottles?

Find 7 pebbles or plastic bottles – or a mixture of both (5 for the baby ducks, one for the Mother duck and one for Father duck). Who do you think will be the biggest duck in the story? Who is the smallest? Do your pebbles/bottles represent this?

Using the paints from your craft pack, paint each pebble/bottle to represent the ducks in the story. Remember what each duck needs – eyes, beak, legs, and feet.

Once your ducks are finished can they swim or do they sink? Place them into a bowl of water to see!
