



Superworm Activities

Playdough Superworm

What you will need. Playdough, beads, cotton wool, sequins, sticks anything else you think that your child can use to create their own superworm.

Using some playdough from your pack you could make your own playdough Superworm! In the story, Superworm turns into a skipping rope and a fishing line to help his friends. Encourage your child to change the shape of their own Superworm into different household objects by rolling, squashing, squeezing, flattening, etc. Superworm could become a chair, a tv, or anything that takes their fancy!

This will be lots of fun and at the same time will be strengthening the muscles in their hands and fingers in readiness for writing!



Creating your own paper Superworm

Can you make your own Superworm?

What you will need: some large sheets of paper, some coloured pens/pencil and/or some lovely sequins or materials to stick on.

Using the paper, encourage your child to draw and cut out a worm shape, they may need some help with this. Show your child how to draw lines along the paper to make it look like a worm. They can then decorate their own Superworm using pencils, crayons, pens or any of the equipment that you have available. (Look in your creative pack and see what you can use).



Creating Bug Hotels

What you will need: cardboard boxes, tubes or empty plastic bottles



Explain to your child that you are going to make small bug hotels for insects and bugs to live in. Show your child how to make small holes in the sides of cardboard tubes, boxes or bottles and explain these will be the 'doors' for the bugs to get in and out. Allow the children to decorate their boxes and bottles and fill with damp natural materials. Place outside and watch and wait for your creepy crawlie visitors!
