Number board using pegs

With your child create a number board. Use a small tea plate or something similar as a template. Place the plate on a piece of card or paper and draw round. Cut out the circle. Divide the circle into 10 sections. Draw dots in each section in a random order e.g. 2 dots in the first section then 7 dots in the next section etc. Next get 10 wooden pegs. Write the number 1 on the first peg, number 2 on the next peg etc. until each peg has a number up to 10. Under the number, draw dots to match the number you have written. You can now begin to match the pegs to the correct quantity. Put the pegs in a bag or box and ask your child to choose a peg. Then place it onto the section of the board with the corresponding number of dots.



Yellow group Activities

Responds to instructions/2 part sequence





Tell your child that you are going to ask them to do two things and see if they can be really clever and follow the instructions. E.g. say Can find me a spoon and give it to the baby? Or Can you find a sock and put it on teddy? Etc.

As Easter is approaching you could use Easter ideas e.g. **Can you put the egg on the plate?**

Write name in different ways



There are a lot of activities that children can do to help them begin writing letters from their name. Children tend to use the obvious choice pens/pencils. Why not make it fun for your child and use some shaving foam for your child to form letters using their finger. You could also use salt and flour.

Rhyming Objects





Get a set of objects that rhyme. Here are some examples, pen/hen, hat/cat, mouse/house, van/man etc. Place the objects on a tray. Ask your child to pick an object and then find the object that rhymes with it.

Making shiny chocolate headbands





Yellow group have enjoyed singing the Easter Bunny song in keyworker. I have thought of a lovely idea for you all. You can design your own Easter egg headband. You can cut round an egg template and decorate it in any colour or pattern you want and then make a headband out of some paper or card by measuring your child's head.
