Caring for our dolls and teddy bears in nursery is something we all love. You could bath your babies or super heroes in the bath, kitchen sink or bowl of water. Remember to take special care when washing their hair and faces. Wrap them in a warm towel once you're finished and dry them thoroughly. You can dress them after their nice bath and maybe read them a bedtime story.





Listening for sounds.

Sit outside with your grown up in the garden or back yard take a pen and piece of paper with you. Listen Carefully at what you can hear. Talk about what you can hear. Can you hear cars drive past, birds singing or people talking? Using your pen make a mark on the paper to create a tally Chart (like we practice in keyworker time). At the end of your listening activity count how many marks you have made. Did you hear lots of different sounds?
