Dear Parents,

Hello and welcome everyone, what a fantastic start to the new school year. All of the children are settling in to Early Learners, enjoying their time with us and beginning to make good relationships with staff. We are so impressed with how easily the children have separated from their adults & entered so calmly, with only a few tears every now and then.

Thank you to all adults for your support and patience with our entry & exit routines. The 'Drop & Go' procedures are quickening up as the children become familiar with the hand sanitizing on entry and the home collection is also quickening up as we become more familiar with recognising all of you. Staff continue to wear face masks/shields when talking to parents if you wish you can still wear face masks when bringing and collecting your child. We continue operating these systems to help us to try & keep the whole school community as possible. I thank you for your support in this.



We continue to keep adults visiting/entering school to a minimum. If you need to speak to a member of staff at drop off or collection, we ask if you can wait to one side & then once staff are free they can speak to you.

We would also like to welcome Miss Hannah Barnes to our Early Learners team. Miss Barnes will be a keyworker working alongside Miss Taylor, Miss Huntington and Mrs Richardson. She is looking forward to working with the children and getting to know all of you. The Early Learner children are one big class, where all keyworkers work with all children under the direction of myself and Mrs Wilson (our Deputy Headteacher) as the class teacher.

Our initial learning theme this half term is "Early Days", giving children lots of opportunities to learn the routines & expectations of Early Learners as well as discovering lots of new learning experiences. We will soon upload some photographs to the school website so you can see some of the lovely things the children have been doing.

School Fund

Please can we remind you for safeguarding reasons do not use mobile phones in or around the nursery school. (This includes texting, phoning, playing games or taking photographs).



Social Media/ Networking Sites

As we all know Social networking sites such as Facebook and Twitter are now widely used. This type of media allows people to communicate in ways that were not previously possible. However, such sites can be inappropriately used by some as a means of expressing negative or offensive views about schools and their staff.

Although social networking sites may appear to be the quickest and easiest way to express frustrations or concerns about the School (and those associated with it), it is rarely appropriate to do so. Other channels, such



as a private and confidential discussion with the School, or using the School's formal complaints process are much better suited to this.

The School considers the following examples to be inappropriate uses of social networking sites. (This list is non-exhaustive and intended to provide examples only):

- Making allegations about staff or pupils at the School/cyber-bullying;
- Making complaints about the School/staff at the School;
- Making defamatory statements about the School or staff at the School;
- Posting negative/offensive comments about specific pupils/staff at the School;
- Posting racist comments;
- Posting comments which threaten violence.

Please can we ask for your co-operation in following these guidelines when using Social media/ Networking sites.
